

Primary PE and Sport Premium Plan for 2017/18

The Primary PE and Sport Premium was launched by the government in April 2013 and is available for three years to July 2016. It is ring-fenced funding to be used by the school to improve the quality and breadth of our PE, sport and physical activity provision.

The national vision is for: *“All pupils leaving primary school [to be] physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.”*

In academic year 2017/18, we will receive approximately **£19,660**. Having consulted with pupils and parents, and to support our wider vision and plans for PE and sport, we plan to spend the Premium in the following ways.

Although the remainder budget has not yet been allocated for 2017/18, the proposed areas for funding that school are looking in to are:

- Additional outdoor learning courses
- Equipment to enhance the PE provision (both indoors and outdoor)
- A contribution towards the school minibus so that sport competitions can be attended.
- A possible contribution towards additional provision to enhance PE lessons from local secondary schools.
- An apprentice will be employed to lead PE sessions and to support staff development in teaching PE.
- Links to Teesside University to do sport in the Roseworth area.
