Rhyme is where the final sounds in a word sound the same.

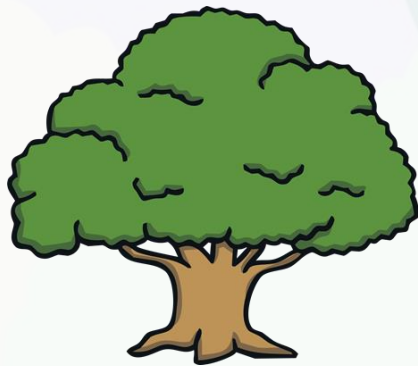
E.g. bat, cat, rat.

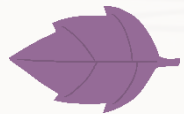
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# Tiger
